What is Radon? Radon is a radioactive gas that occurs naturally from the breakdown of uranium and radium in soil and rocks. Because it's invisible and odorless, it's easy to overlook. Radon gas moves from the soil and into our homes through cracks in the foundation and openings around pumps, pipes and drains.

How can I test for Radon in my home? Fortunately, testing for radon is simple and inexpensive. Test kits can be bought at many hardware stores. The NJ DEP Radon Program provides a list of certified companies that provide testing services or do-it-yourself test kits. Call (800) 648-0394 or visit www.ngradon.org online.

What if tests show dangerous levels of radon in my home? Radon mitigation systems can be installed at a cost similar to that of other home repairs. Call the number above or visit the website for a list of certified mitigation companies.
