

BOARD OF HEALTH
July 11, 2019

On Thursday, July 11, 2019, at 7:34 P.M., the regularly scheduled meeting of the Holland Township Board of Health was held in the meeting room at the Municipal Building, Church Road.

Before the meeting was opened, the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson, Audrey Balogh and the following statement was read at the commencement of the meeting.

Adequate notice of this regular meeting was given pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act, by the Township Clerk on December 13, 2018, by:

1. Posting such notice on the bulletin board at the Municipal Building and on the Holland Township website.
2. Mailing the same to the Hunterdon County Democrat and the Express Times.

Tony Szumski made a motion, seconded by Donna Lizanich, to accept the minutes of June 13, 2019. Jeffrey Waldron abstained. Motion carried.

Audrey welcomed Jeffrey Waldron back after a medical leave.

Discussion on last month's pending issues:

Audrey Balogh contacted Larry Creveling, Zoning Officer, regarding property at 139 Hawk Schoolhouse Road, where the lawn had not been mowed all summer. This property is a foreclosure, so Larry contacted the Mortgage Company – the lawn has now been mowed.

Property at 168 Bellis Road. Effluent running on road, septic pumped and resident moved. Audrey Balogh spoke to Carla Hobbs who said an inspection was made on June 21, 2019. The lawn is overgrown and no effluent coming out on the ground. Audrey contacted Larry Creveling who gave the name of the Mortgage Company handling this property, since the owner has moved away. Carla Hobbs can now send a letter of violations and issue a warrant for his arrest.

Pearl reported she had spoken to Karen DeMarco questioning whether the County Board of Health still used the Everbridge System, NJ LINC'S Health Alert System, LINC'S Notifications, Rabies Cases by County, Infectious Disease Summary and Zika information, since we haven't gotten any information in the past six months. Karen stated they still use all of these reports and she will speak to the various people making the distribution to see why Holland Township is not receiving any reports. (Pearl has not received an answer back from the County.)
