

BEWARE OF PHONE SCAMS: A MESSAGE FROM CHIEF OF POLICE

Over the past few months, we have received numerous reports of residents falling victim to various types of phone scams. These scams can take many forms, including calls from individuals posing as government officials, law enforcement officers, or representatives from well-known companies. These scammers often use intimidation tactics or offer enticing promises to trick individuals into providing personal information or sending money.

All residents must be vigilant and aware of the signs of a phone scam. Here are some tips to help you protect yourself:

Verify Caller Identity: Always verify the identity of the caller before providing any personal information or financial details. Government agencies and legitimate organizations will never ask for sensitive information over the phone.

Be Skeptical of Unsolicited Calls: If you receive a call from an unknown number or a number you do not recognize, exercise caution. Do not trust unsolicited calls, especially if they demand immediate action or threaten consequences.

Do Not Provide Personal Information: Avoid sharing personal information such as Social Security numbers, bank account details, or passwords over the phone, especially if you did not initiate the call.

Hang Up and Verify: If you suspect that a call may be a scam, hang up immediately. You can then independently verify the caller's identity by contacting the organization or agency directly using a trusted phone number.

Report Suspicious Activity: If you receive a suspicious call, report it to the Holland Township Police Department. By reporting these incidents, you can help us track patterns and protect others in the community.

Remember, scammers are constantly evolving their tactics, so it is essential to stay informed and remain cautious. Educate yourself and your loved ones about common phone scams and how to recognize them.

At the Holland Township Police Department, we are committed to ensuring the safety and security of our community. We are here to assist you and address any concerns you may have regarding phone scams or any other security-related issues.

The Board of Health

A serious issue that the Board of Health handles is faulty septic systems and granting the necessary waivers where applicable to place these systems back into compliance. New homeowners who have come from an area where there is town-wide sewer service might now have their first encounter with a septic system. Some steps to keep a septic system functioning properly are as follows:

Have the tank pumped out and inspected at least once every three years or more often if necessary based upon the number of people in the household or amount of wastewater generated. Regarding the drain field, vehicles such as cars, trucks or other heavy vehicles should not be driven over it, and trees and shrubs as well as hard surface construction such as concrete patios should not be placed over the drain field.

Efficient water use can improve the operation of the septic system. Leaky faucets and toilets add unnecessarily to the system. At replacement time install a high efficiency toilet and add aerators to faucets. When doing laundry, select the proper load size to minimize water usage and at replacement time select a high efficiency washing machine. Do not flush bathroom items such as Q-tips, feminine hygiene products or dental floss, and in the kitchen do not put grease, oil or household chemicals down the drain.


Septic system repair and replacement are quite expensive, and following simple guidelines can help prevent same.



Agriculture Advisory Committee

The NJ State Agriculture Development Committee (SADC) recently announced:

New "Next Gen" Farmer Program

New Jersey has invested more to preserve its agricultural land base than any state in the nation, resulting in more than one out of every three acres of farmland being enrolled in the state's Farmland Preservation Program. The potential for return on this investment can be fully realized only if there are enough qualified and dedicated farmers to cultivate and care for the State's farmland.

According to American Farmland Trust (AFT), more than 40 percent of America's agricultural land is owned by people aged 65 and older and will be in transition within the next 15 years, putting both family farmers and the land they steward at risk. AFT estimates that 371 million acres of farmland and ranchland could be in transition due to the age of farmland owners. Meanwhile, many would-be farmers can't afford to enter the field.

New Jersey is addressing the issue as the State Agriculture Development Committee (SADC) is establishing a "Next Generation Farmers" program to support new and beginning famers in accessing land, securing the technical training, and establishing new, viable farming enterprises.

"We will be hiring two new staff members to research, design, develop, and implement a comprehensive system to identify, train, equip and support the next generation of New Jersey farmers in coordination with existing programs where possible, "SADC Executive Director Susan Payne said.

New Jersey's agricultural operations are comprised almost entirely of family farms with those relations being the primary pathway for young farmers to gain access to land. Farmers generally were either raised in a farm family or married into one – and farmland was passed down from one generation to the next. In New Jersey and across the nation, children of farm families have

increasingly chosen to leave the farm and pursue other vocations, creating a void in what historically has been the seamless transition of farm operations to the next generation.

Many people who want to become farmers, both younger ones beginning, and others starting second careers, don't have access to the land needed to start a new farming business. While would-be farms are typically located in rural areas, an increasing number of people are interested in producing food in suburban and urban environments to reach underserved populations.

"We want to identify changes in state and federal policy, rules, and legislation to achieve the goals of a next-generation farmer program in collaboration with existing stakeholders," Payne said. "These include American Farmland Trust, New Jersey-based land trusts, Rutgers University Cooperative Extension, New Jersey Farm Bureau, urban agriculture gardens and initiatives, the Northeast Organic Farmers Association of New Jersey, the New Jersey Department of Labor, and county and local partners in the development and implementation of the program. We want to reach a diverse range of potential participants, including womenowned business interests, and underserved communities."

There may also be opportunities for veterans to seek careers in agriculture.

"The SADC wants to collaborate with Joint Base Maguire-Dix-Lakehurst to allow U.S. veterans to pursue agriculture as their next career and create an effective mentoring program between retiring and new and prospective farmers," New Jersey Department of Agriculture Assistant Secretary Joe Atchison III said.

HOLLAND TOWNSHIP ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSION

HERE IS WHAT WE DID IN 2023

Water and Waterways

- We developed Stormwater Goals to be in conformance with the new Tier A designation from the State of New Jersey. We also created a new Webpage to inform and promote understanding of best practices.
- Our Musconetcong River (MWA) liaison brought awareness of the "Wild and Scenic" designation and acquired a speaker to explain the importance of the river and its history. New signs were acquired to acknowledge the section in Holland Township as "Wild and Scenic Musconetcong."
- We brought to the township through MWA, "Flow Together," a workshop which sought
 advice on clean water priorities that could be included in a new watershed management
 plan. We received data on the quality of the water in the Musconetcong and the nature of
 pollutants such as septic tanks, animal waste and runoff.
- We acquired a grant through the Delaware River expansion of the "Wild and Scenic" designation for interpretive signs along the O'sakame Preserve Trail.



- We presented two programs regarding the wildlife in our area.
- In "Coexisting with Coyotes" we learned about the myths and history of the coyote in NJ and how it compared to other predator species.
- In "Creating a Backyard Habitat for Backyard Pollinators and Birds" we were taught how to attract beneficial wildlife like birds and bees to our properties.

Trails

- We had a speaker discuss the portion of the Highlands Trail that runs through the township and its relationship to the longer, four-state Highlands Trail system.
- We offered a program by a naturalist from the Hunterdon County Parks system who conducted a walk around the Holland Trail at Riegel Ridge.
- O'sakame Preserve Trail We acquired a grant to develop interpretive signs along the trail. We also had a map created and acquired two new benches.
- We continue to monitor and provide access to brochures of Common Birds and Common Trees at the trailheads and online of Holland Trail and O'sakame Trail, and we maintain the kiosks at the two trails.


Trees

- An Arbor Day seedling give-away was conducted during which we distributed 200 native trees with the help of a Boy Scout troop #187. An article was written about the event for Holland Happenings.
- We offered "Walk and Talk about Trees," during which we pointed out the different species of trees around the Holland Trail and considered the threat of invasive species.
- Additional trees along the Holland Trail were marked and designated with a QR code. The same was done at the O'sakame Trail. This is an ongoing project where plaques are placed on trees with the name and a QR Code. The QR Code brings people to the Holland Township Website for a video and fuller description of the tree.
- We held a dedication and tree planting in honor of Mr. Henry Gore with this family in attendance. Mr. Gore was a past recipient of the Environmental Achievement Award of New Jersey Association of Environmental Commissions.

Community Education and Outreach

- We were proud to present a successful Speaker Program for the second year.
- We offered five programs in 2023 that were attended by 15-40 people of a variety of ages and interests.
- We provided six articles for Holland Happenings in Spring and Fall of 2023:
- Through our website, we collected and developed a mailing list for our programs which is being utilized to inform and encourage attendance. Attendees are offered the opportunity to provide topics for future programming.


